Here's the latest....

1. The leaning pine tree has been removed and helps the view. Greg arranged this.

2. The railroad ties were removed with the help of Genesis House. The museum accepted them as they have plans for a picnic area to be constructed in two years or so. That saves us \$21,000 in destruction and recycling fees.

3. The trimming of the plants is completed with the help of a lot of people.



4. The application for a construction permit is before the City Planning department. The architect and general contractor are working with the Planning Department to iron out all the problems. So far, it looks like the solution will actually save us some money and make construction easier.

5. We expect to start construction in the middle of September and expect it to last until the end of November. Until then it is best to postpone as many events as possible.

6. Delays are to be expected. Also expect dirt, inconvenience and noise.

Parking Lot Closurenot the Church

The weekend of Sunday August 31st the parking lot is still open. This is an exciting time in the life of the church, in a few weeks our parking lot will have had a much needed face lift. Meanwhile it will be necessary to park elsewhere as the construction goes on. (And that does not mean staying at home). We will need to park on the street. Entrance to the church will only be from the street. Walking down the sidewalk between the C E building and the Sanctuary and then through the choir room.

Plans for your assistance have been made for Sunday morning. At curb side in front of the church will be a drop off point for those who would have difficulty walking. A Greeter will be waiting to assist you on your way to service. Drivers who have dropped off passengers, will then proceed to park along west second, west M and Raymond streets. Those who cannot make the walk from their car, a ride will be provided. Others are encouraged to walk the short distance.

After service a ride to your car for those who need assistance will be provided. And drop off passengers will be waiting for you to pick them up.
