We are now going into the eighth week of construction. As expected we have had to make some design changes and change orders.

The sewer system is now repaired. It was completely disintegrated and the section in front of the buildings is completely replaced.

We had to completely close off the parking lot, upper and lower, because people kept crossing the barriers and yellow tape. It is also a complete mess and is dangerous.

The extra grading of the upper parking lot necessitated an extra \$2500 in design changes.

We have retained an electrician to help us with the installation of the solar lights. His fee will be substantially lower than the \$35,000 quoted by another electrical company. We feel a lot better having him on board.


