



Pastor's Report

What a GREAT year 2019 was for Community Congregational Church. At the end of 2018, our budget and finance committee projected our 2019 budget would being the red \$15,000. We started cutting, and we cut and cut,





We took on new projects this year we had not planned for. We put in a new sound system, new lights, new carpeting and a ton of little projects. We were busy, we spent more time out and about giving generously to the community. We opened our doors more, made ourselves more accessible, bought a new beautiful flowing rainbow flag for the front of the church, gave more to our friends of the street and I spent more time with visitors. We brought in an Associate Minister, Rev. Melissa McBride, while I was out for surgery and recovering. Seeing how valuable a resource she

was to us the PPRC and Vice Moderator I discussed keeping Pastor Melissa on as the needs of our congregation have grown.


Community Congregational Church was truly church in 2019, as we came up with new ways to be church with each other with a new program of education called "After Word." This ongoing program brings presenters who are either from our community or from outside our community who present on a specific subject. This attracted more folks from the Benicia area for our After Word. We also were a venue for various concerts held in our Sanctuary.

Speaking of music and sound, a new sound system was installed this year, this new sound system allows us to have six separate mics talking at once, in six separate locations in the church, a special bi-directional microphone, new hearing assisted devices for those who need them, and special country-man headset mics for three remote mics. These enhancements to our sound system not only enhance our Sunday worship but make our sanctuary space more attractive to those in our community who seek to use our space. We now live stream our worship service over the web, thus bringing in a larger community.

We also brought in 14 New Active Members this year, folks who hit the ground running, several of whom joined council right away! What an amazing bunch of faithful followers of Jesus! Speaking of faithful followers of Jesus, we had lots of little ones joining us in worship in 2019. We also put in a new rug and play area in the back of the sanctuary for our children and we have gotten a ton of complements about how welcoming that appears to young families and how it lets our little ones be more comfortable in worship.

Associate Pastor's Report

Music Ministry

Dr. Barbara Hamm, Minister of Music



Grateful: this is the theme of our church this year, and that's what I am as I reflect upon my music ministry this past year at CCC. I am grateful for the opportunity to immerse myself in something I love doing. I am equally grateful for the trust invested in me to lead CCC's music program, and I try to encourage as many people as I can to participate!

I am truly grateful for the Sanctuary Choir and the integral part it plays in the worship and ministry of CCC. The choir sings regularly for worship services most Sundays September through June. We perform as well for our Christmas concert and occasionally for memorial services; this last August we sang at the memorial service for Milly Thomas. The word seems to be getting out—we added two new basses a year ago, while this year we added an alto, Pat Obendorf, and two sopranos, Dona Bovey and Mary Susan Gast (who has frequently stepped in to help the last several

years.) We always welcome additional singers for special services such as Christmas, Easter, Pentecost: this last year Nancy Gilman, Bret Lortie, Laura Pyles, Roger Reaber, and Dennis Meade joined us at different times.

Sanctuary Choir women join with additional women and girls to comprise the Women and Girls' Chorus, which sings occasionally for worship services and also for the Christmas concert. CCC is currently blessed with quite a number of children; the Children's Choir is always a highlight of the Christmas concert. The children also sing as part of their Children's Pageant the Sunday before Christmas.

The Rolling Tones Handbell Choir plays for worship services throughout the year and also occasionally accompanies choir anthems. They play for the Christmas concert and for the December Second Saturday feeding of our friends on the street in Vallejo. They also play for community events.

Two smaller groups also contribute to CCC's music program—Jazz Gorilla and the Hippie Chicks, both of whom perform for the Christmas concert. In addition to playing frequently for worship services at CCC, Jazz Gorilla performs for events beyond the local church, being the featured performance again this year at the Global Holiday Faire in December at First Christian Church of Vallejo. Individual soloists, both vocal and instrumental, offer their musical gifts to CCC as well. We are indeed blessed to have so many musicians who have found a welcome home at CCC.

The renovations in our sanctuary have made it a very acoustically attractive venue for visiting musical groups to perform in, and a number of them schedule concerts and/or rehearsals in our space: the Vallejo Choral Society, the Golden Gate Symphony Chorus, Soprano Alto Singers of Solano (SASS), and the Benicia Chamber Players. We are grateful for them all.

Closely aligned with my music ministry and growing organically from it is my own hymn writing. I have conducted three workshops this year to introduce churches to my 2018 collection, Table of Grace, published by Hope Publishing Company in summer 2018. One of these was at the UCC Annual Gathering at Sonoma State University in June, and another was at Grace Presbyterian Church in Walnut Creek in August. In late October I spent a weekend at the UCC Tulare church in the Central Valley, conducting a Saturday hymnody workshop, presenting a number of my hymns during the Sunday morning worship service, and leading a Sunday evening Taizé service with musicians from that congregation. The Tulare Church retained several copies of my collection for use by their congregation. In December the First Christian Church of Vallejo bought a set for use by their congregation. I am always thrilled to learn that a congregation has sung a hymn of mine, more often than not "Come to the Table of Grace."

Hope Publishing Company accepted five more of my hymns this year. And I have been invited by Oregon Catholic Press to submit hymn texts for its Women's Hymn Text Project to be published in 2020. I have submitted several hymn texts to OCP for consideration. I have much for which to be grateful!

2019 was an active and exciting year for us at Community Congregational. We had the unexpected event of Pastor Renie having surgery and being absent for 12 weeks during the summer. However, she had us well-trained and the church not only maintained, but flourished!

We were blessed with three pastors who are also members and who provided leadership in worship services. We cannot thank the Reverends Mary Susan Gast, Roger Reaber and Bret Lortie enough for



their inspiration. They were ably supported by our very active Worship Committee, under the leadership of Priscilla Lane and Marilyn Scrutchins. Rev. Melissa McBride was hired part time to provide pastoral care, and she was so wonderful that we asked her to continue as Associate Minister after Rev. Renie returned.

Council decided we needed to be more visible to the community in our commitment to our open and affirming welcome and a rainbow flutter flag was installed in the front of the church. We also opened the use of our sanctuary to more groups, including the Golden Gate Chorale, Benicia Chamber Players and Vallejo Choral Society. Thanks to Jim Lessenger, the church Policy and Procedures Manual was reviewed, updated and approved by the Council. A meeting was held with City officials to gather information about the feasibility of selling part of our property along M Street. After review of the costs and process involved, no action was recommended.

Our building continued to need loving care and maintenance. A major project involved jackhammering the concrete slab at the front of the church and installation of carpet. Following that, a successful fund-drive resulted in new lights in the sanctuary, and final installation of a new sound system. CCC/UCC has entered the 21st century!

We introduced the idea of WYI (What's Your Idea?) at each Council meeting. This resulted in a renewed annual picnic in August, participation in a community video of "Benicia Our Home," and several forums after Fellowship which we called AfterWord:

- 1. Social Media and Your Kids (cancelled due to speaker called away in an emergency)
- 2. Caregiving
- 3. Animal Appreciation
- 4. End of Life

There is much more to read about our year in this report. We are thrilled to have Rev. Renie back in good health. We welcomed fourteen new members (Michelle Padilla, Carol Gieg, Todd Wolf, Dona Bovey, Bret and Cindi Lortie, Kathy Berry, Letty Tomas, Kathy Monroe, Andy Zinkevich, Kim Webb, Kim Osborn and Claire Hanson) and unexpectedly ended the year in the black. The GOOD NEWS is that CCC/UCC is thriving and working in the community to live up to our pledge to "live fully, love wastefully and lead courageously" as followers of Jesus.

This is our first fiscal year based on the calendar year. The years 2017 through 2018 were a transitional time from a July to June fiscal year to a January to December fiscal year.

Fiscally, the church is stable, with net cash reserves of \$36,135. Expenses averaged \$19,281 per month, so the cash reserves represent about 1.9 months of expense liability. We have been meeting our loan payments for the campus renovation/parking lot and paid \$6,759 off the principal on the loan (ending with remaining principal of \$322,763).

The Financial Secretary report shows that more funds were received by the church than is indicated in the revenue reported in the Treasurer report. This is due to funds received which were not

included in budgetary revenue and which went into restricted accounts (such as the Weekend in the Trees retreat, the sanctuary renovations, and pledges paid in advance).

During the 2019 fiscal year, our revenue exceeded our expenses despite a predicted deficit budget. This was due principally to receiving pledges matching our budget (some individual pledges were not received, but some individual pledges were exceeded and some pledges from the previous year were met), an increase in loose offerings and increased revenue from building use. "Loose offerings" are contributions that were not pledged. Expenses were slightly higher than anticipated but were more than offset by the increase in revenue.

Welcome and Growth

The Welcome and Growth committee worked hard this year to make both newcomers and regulars at our church feel welcome and involved. Kathy Dieden, Chole McGraw, Nancy Purtle, Shelby Riddle, Marlan Shanks and, of course Pat Obendorf and myself, tried not only to greet everyone at the door, but to insure they were welcomed at the close of service and invited to join us for Fellowship. A special thanks to all our members who stepped up when we had more visitors than we could get to and engaged with the newcomers seated around them. Pat O did a great job of producing new name tags so that newcomers got a printed name tag right away.

Our attendance averaged 54 attendees at our worship services, with December having the highest numbers (115 at our Dec. 22nd worship) and May, June, and July being our low months. The children's average was 8, a number that increased this fall and Christmas season.

Other projects that Welcome and Growth worked on this year were:

- With the help of Deborah Shanks, Liz Cleves, Barbara Hamm, and Dennis Meade, we researched how to get the word out to the Benicia/Vallejo community about who we were as a church and what we had to offer them. We created a banner we can attach to a card table to set up at community events, 4x6 cards we can have available, and business cards that we have asked the congregation to take and hand out when anyone asks about our church. We have already used the banner, 4x6 cards, and card table at the Gay Pride event at the Gazebo Park and have the business cards available on the Welcome Podium in the Fellowship Hall every Sunday for visitors and members to take.
- It seemed just as important to have a place where our own church community can keep up with what CCC is up to, so we redesigned the bulletin board between the office and the sanctuary to have 3 sections: a place for a calendar of our regularly scheduled activities, a section where we put up flyers/posters for special CCC events or those put on by groups we
 - support, and a third section for photos of all the wonderful activities our community takes on. Keeping that up to date has been a major production—we are always looking for photos. Please just email any you have taken of CCC activities to ngauger7@comcast.net.— we will be sure they get posted.
- We sent welcoming notes to all first time visitors who signed the Guest register with addresses or emails, a total of 28 for this year.

Fellowship

This year our fellowship committee consisted of many volunteers just stepping up on various Sundays since we did not have a committee chair. But we could not have had fellowship this year if Nancy Gillman did not continue to buy our much-needed paper products, and of course our coffee. Susan Stofan was amazing again this year with her ever faithful stewardship of chili and mac and cheese and we are so very grateful to the countless folks who signed up week in and week out to bring a snack or a full meal for Sunday fellowship.

We at Community Congregational Church celebrated 2019 52 times this year always with some food, some talk and always a warm cup of coffee. In 2019 we made a decision to help normalize a culture of sustainability and be more environmentally friendly. We no longer use plastic utensils and so each Sunday our fellowship hosts or someone from the fellowship team wash all utensils in our sink for reuse thus saving our planet one fork at a time. Along with the positive environmental impact, there is also a clear financial incentive for this change.

Fellowship hosted many of the Building and Grounds Fellowship Days as well as Games Nights, our Annual Shrove Tuesday and our Annual Thanksgiving Feast with over 60 in attendance. 2019 was another great year for Community Congregational Fellowship.

Mission and Outreach

Community Congregational Church's mission is to follow the example of Jesus by caring for and honoring each other and the world. Through the Mission and Outreach Committee, our church actively reaches into our local and wider communities in support of causes and good works which are in keeping with our values.

Five percent of our pledges go to the missions of this church, in addition to the individual contributions and donations for specific drives. This is a look back on where we put our resources in 2019.

- We are "Five for Five" church, allocating money in support of our UCC sponsored missions, including: Our Church's Wider Mission, Neighbors in Need, One Great Hour of Sharing, Strengthen the Church, and the Christmas Fund (for pastors in need).
- In February, we collected hundreds of pounds of food from our members (and from Playing to Learn) to donate to the Food Bank of Contra Costa and Solano.
- At Easter, supported by the collection for the "Lilies Fund", we purchased apartment starter kits and donated them to First Place for Youth to assist young adults aging out of the foster system with their new homes.
- Our congregation came together in the summer to put together backpacks with school supplies for young elementary students (and some for their teachers) who live in the farming communities around Pescadero. Each year we work with the people at Puente de la Costa Sur, the non-profit serving this impoverished community, to get the backpacks to these children.
- We donated funds to support the medical services provided by Planned Parenthood of Vallejo.
- We also donated money to support of Project Blessing Bags which makes hygiene kits for the homeless.
- At Christmastime, our congregation signed up to buy presents for Benicia families lacking financial resources to celebrate gift giving.
- We retrieved, stored and distributed the many coats collected by the Benicia Public Library over the holidays, giving them out to people living on the cold streets.
- Our "Poinsettias Fund" supplied money used to purchase scores of new underwear and socks for our homeless, which decorated our sanctuary on Christmas Sunday.
- We completed the 7th year of our continuing work each Second Saturday serving a hot, healthy breakfast, joyous music, and loving fellowship to our friends who live on the street.

Our efforts do make a difference. I am grateful to those who step up to make sure the work gets done. A special word of appreciation to committee members Nancy Gilman, Janet Murrell, Penny Taylor, Debbie Thomas, and Donna Hill, along with Nora Gauger and Kathy Monroe for the heavy lifting. My heartfelt thanks to the many more not named yet core to the functioning of our missions, who lend their time and energies caring for our community and helping make the world a better place for it.
